This paper has improved. Revisions has been made on my major comments.

Minor left-over remarks:

- It remains quite unclear what the hypotheses were behind the independent variables reported on page 7. I would suggest to replace the hypothesis given at the bottom of page 12 to the introduction.

Thank you for the suggestion. We now state the hypothesis given at the bottom of page 12 in the introduction as follows:

“We also wanted to explore the hypothesis that a lower percentage of international medical graduates would be associated with better characteristics of teaching CPGs.”

- page 8, bottom: Conducting objective assessment OF KNOWLEDGE
Suggestion to add: of knowledge.

We have added “knowledge” as suggested.

- Page 12: While the LIMITED availability of CPGs **Suggestion to add: limited.**
